### Maharashtra

#### Government Response

- The State of Maharashtra has **6,99,858** active cases, with a doubling rate of 41.2 (Days) out of which 33,30,747 have recovered, with active rate of 17.09% is present. 62,479 people have deceased with a fatality rate of 1.53% as of 22nd April 2021.
- The State reported **67,013** New COVID Cases on 22<sup>nd</sup> April 2021.
- A private hospital in Palghar District caught fire due to blast in the Air Condition. It claimed lives of 13 COVID positive patients. The fire was controlled and did not go cover other floors of the hospital.

#### NGO Response:

- Started from 30th March and as on 23rd April through Community outreach, field activations, crowd management, vaccine help desks, registration support, vaccine quiz, face-to-face and public messaging and reinforcing CAB in slums and housing societies of Mumbai, Pune, Thane and Nagpur.
- 6 partner organizations and 120 volunteers from the Maha PECO Net are working on field for the vaccination awareness drive.
- Till date 5 local clubs are able to reach 1,25,000 population directly, 5,500 people have been registered on the spot. An additional support of vaccination 25000, through local hospitals working with 6 hospitals and managing 10 on the spot vaccine help desks. Four mobile help desks are also moving around in the city. Over 13000 were assisted to visit to the vaccination center for taking the vaccine shots.
- In addition, in NESCO Jumbo facilities ( Goregaon, Mumbai) , 125 WASH basins converted to elbow operated for Covid positive patients under treatment.
- Partner Project Mumbai, has launched a health care infra boost fundraiser to support municipal and state Hospitals and doctors.
- The Maha PECO Net has provided five oxygen concentrators, over 3000 PPE kits, 15 high frequency oxygen machines, medical consumables , an ECG machine ten wheel chairs to healthcare institutions including NESCO jumbo COVID center, Seven hills Hospital, NSCI jumbo COVID center, Poddar hospital, Elizabeth hospital and the MCGM operated HB Trauma Care Centre and St George Hospital And over 200 grocery kits to families which have lost employment due to COVID.
- Maha-PECO-NET Program Secretariat, YUVA recently conducted a rapid needs assessment. Based on which the work is being conducted in the Mumbai Metropolitan region. The situation is grim and getting worse.
- The strategies of ration support for most vulnerable population groups, broad level vaccination drives and healthcare related support, that PECO net partners are adopting is critically important.
