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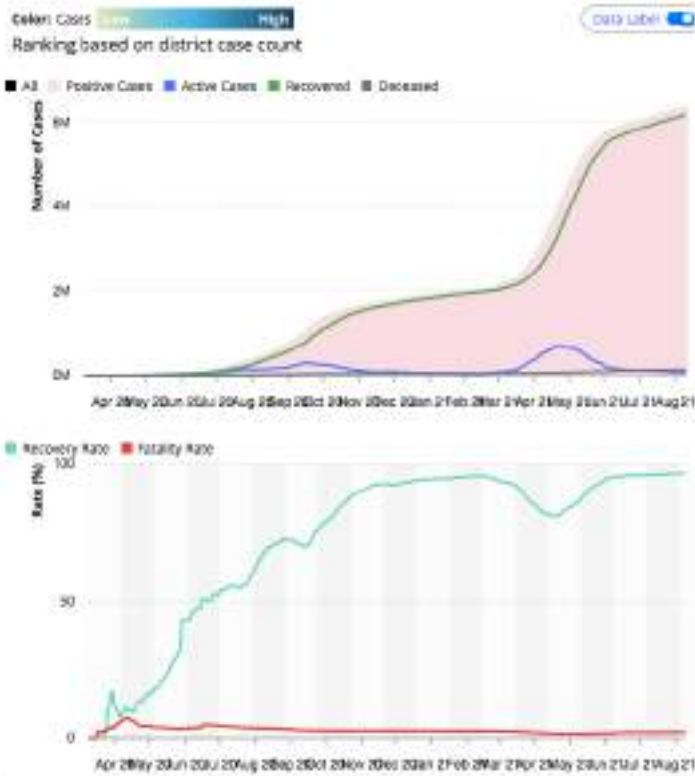
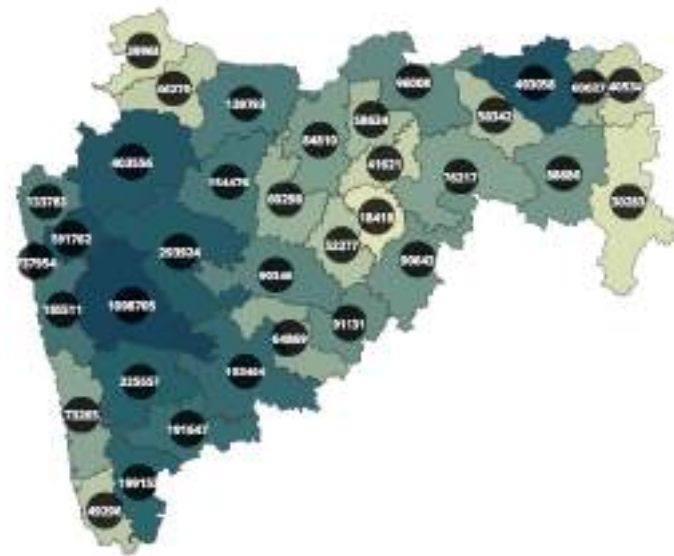

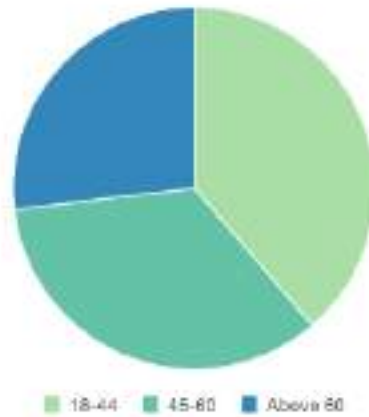

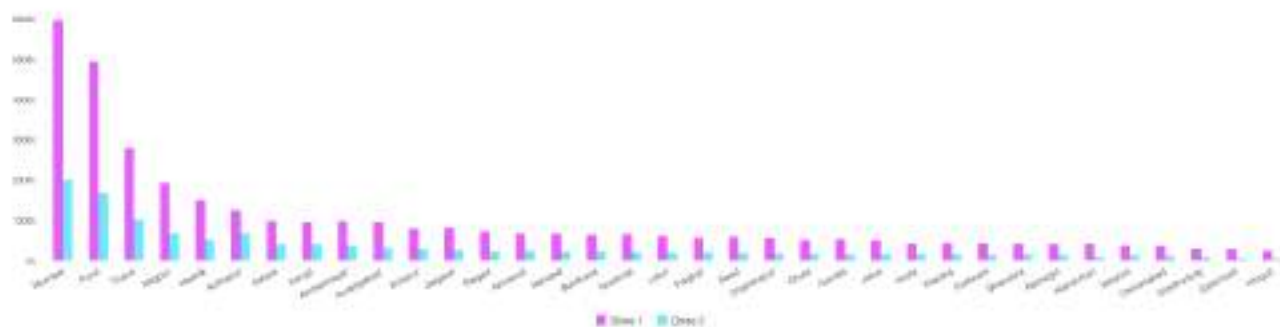

Vaccination by Age

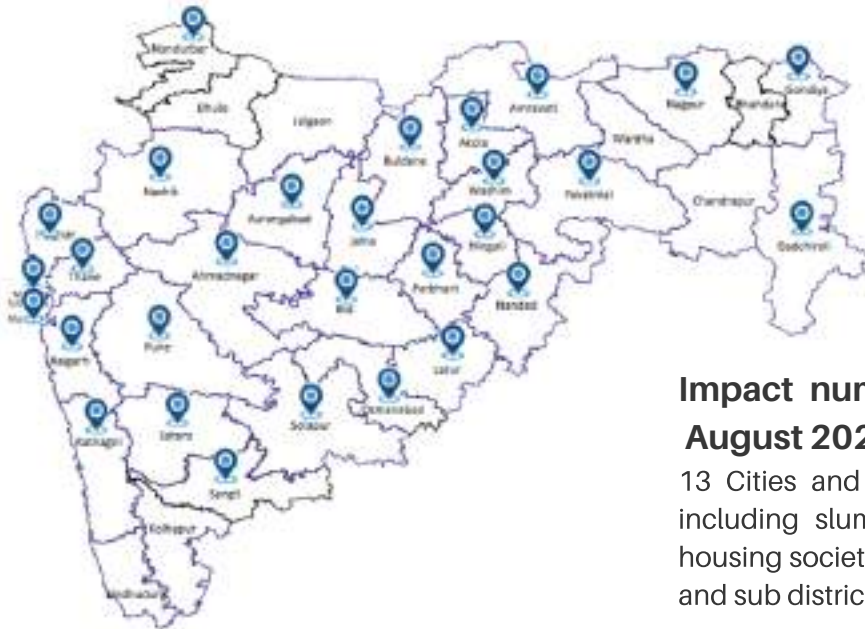

Other Initiatives in detail

URBAN

- **Alert Citizens Forum (ACF)** - 6 Antigen Testing Camps arranged in communities through which 478 people assisted in getting tested in Mumbai. Successful participation of transgender community in vaccination awareness and registration activities. Alert Citizen Forum with support from **Entod Pharmaceuticals, Rotary Club of Bombay Seacoast and Maha PECOnet** distributed 1000 self care kits in total on 27 May. 110 kits went to the Mumbai police staff and 890 kits to sanitation workers and rag pickers staff. Each kit consists of reusable masks, eye drops, sanitizer and soap. ACF has been conducting vaccination information and registration camps through door-to-door mega phones and door-to-door visits in the hilly slums east of Bhandup area to help people register for the vaccine. In this, 8 Days 12 transgender fellows and alert citizen activists visited to 483 chawls (5784 houses total reach of 23136 people) and helped them by giving information & online registration. Shared on 2 June.
- **CACR** - On 12 April 99 Elbow operated taps installed at Nesco Jumbo Centre, 3000 people benefitted daily. 10 boxes of Lifeboy soap containig 1400 soaps donated to Chota Sion Vaccination Centre on 21 April. CACR with support from **National Stock Exchange Foundation and MahaPeconet** started

food, ration kit and masks distribution in different pockets of Mumbai. Team has taken support from **Dabbawala Association** for transportation and distribution of the packed meals through EECO Van on 3 May, distributing 225 meals daily, 9920 meals distributed till 10 June. This process will also help in reviving the lost livelihood of Dabbawalas. On 13 May provided 450 ration kits to Commercial Sex Workers (CSWs) in Kamthipura and distributed 920 Protein enriched cookies to children of CSWs residing at Shelter homes. CACR - donated 6300 soaps (Areas - NESCO jumbo center, BKC Centre). CACR set up Elbow taps at BKC Jumbo centre, and on 20th May, 2021 a total of 50 taps have been installed. Additionally, CACR provided 650 ration kits to CSWs, rag pickers and other vulnerable groups on 18 and 19 May 2021. CACR and Mumbai's Dabbawalas featured in Citizens Matters. On 2 June - 37 senior citizens at Vijay Ashram, Vikhroli registered for COVID19 vaccination with the help of the local corporator. On 4 June, **CACR** with help of **NGO Stree Mukti Sanghatana** helped Raggpickers Community in M/E ward not only get registered today but also vaccinated within few hours at the new Rafinagar Vaccination Centre. This drive will continue next week as well in various pockets and plan is to reach out to 700-800 Raggpickers and help them get vaccinated. **CACR with World Vision India** completed a very successful 2 week awareness drive across 21 locations in Mumbai on 4 June -One Nation One Ration Card. On 9 June Team CACR and the **dabbawalas** continue the meals distribution program for relatives, attendees and frontline health workers at KEM, Tata Memorial and Wadia Hospitals. **Support from NSE Foundation** to continue the 1000 meals a day program. On 11 June CACR in partnership with **Satchikitsak**



Prasarak Mandal and NSE Foundation distributed meals to the needy relatives of the patients admitted in Shri. Vasantrao Naik Government Medical College Hospital, Yavatmal. They plan to distribute 350 meals everyday for a month. On 16 June, CACR installed Non-touch elbow operated taps and basins at 24 MCGM Health Care Facilities. On 1 July, CACR with support of **UNICEF** initiated the process of installing 133 high quality elbow operated taps at Bai Jerbai Wadia Hospital. Starting on 2 July, CACR with support of **MahaPeconet** and **CASA**, is conducting a 4 day awareness workshop on menstrual hygiene along with teaching tribal women on how to make good quality reusable pads. CACR is also starting the **ONGC Swachhta Pakhwada** on 2nd July by distributing sanitizers, masks and hand gloves to Safai Karmacharis in H/E ward, this will continue over the next week, reaching out to each chowky, health posts, municipal markets vendors, police stations, auto rickshaw drivers, etc. **CACR** reached out to Ragpickers community in Goregaon and Malad for distribution of 600 ration kits with support from **Rise Infinity Foundation, Glenmark Foundation and Caring Friends** on 8 July. **CACR's ONGC Swachata Pakhwada** continued on 9 July with distribution of 3500 hygiene kits to safai karmacharis, police stations, auto rickshaw drivers, municipal markets and general public as well. **CACR's ONGC Swachata Pakhwada** continued on 11 July with the distribution of hygiene kits to safai karamcharis, health posts, municipal markets, police stations. A total of 5500 kits have been distributed. On 3 August Team **CACR with support of Rise Infinity Foundation/Idobro Impact and Smart Aid Foundation**, set up help desks at 3 locations today coupled with door to door registrations, crowd management and coordination with respective vaccination centres and MCGM Public Health Department in M/E ward. Almost 324 registrations done in a

day, will be following up for getting them vaccinated and helping senior citizens/ people with special needs to get vaccinated. **RISE infinity foundation**, is developing a Whatsapp Chatbot to complement this initiative. This will be an informational bot and also connecting to the help-desks setup.

- **Project Mumbai** - Between 19-23 April donated - i. 5 Oxygen Concentrators ii. 3000 PPE Kits iii. 15 high frequency Oxygen machine iv. Medical Consumables v. 1 ECG Machine vi. 10 wheelchairs vii. 200 grocery kits (Areas - NESCO jumbo Centre, Seven hills, NSCI Jumco Centre, Podar Hospital, Elizabeth Hospital, MCGM HB trauma Centre, St. George hospital). Project Mumbai's #BreatheMumbai mission between 26 April - 9 May added to Mumbai's health infrastructure by providing 15 ventilators, Bi-pap machines, PPE kits and body bags to three mainline hospitals. They also provided meals to 200 cancer Covid patients comprising both adult and pediatric children at the Tata Memorial Cancer Hospital. Sanitisers and masks for Mumbai Police and Maharashtra Police, PPE kits for health workers and staff at crematoriums, soaps and food amenities and grocery kits to over 300 families. They have launched their Oxygen Concentrator delivery facility for people Below Poverty Line and their Non Covid

Hospitals Dashboard, which is being driven by their team of volunteers. On 17 May 2021, Project Mumbai has launched a free service of Oxygen concentrators for any and every Covid positive patient across Mumbai. It will be strictly on a returnable basis with a refundable deposit. Their next step is delivering OCs to as many district hospitals in need. Project Mumbai's initiative #BREATHEMAHARASHTRA is expanding outreach to provide oxygen support to people across Maharashtra. They aim to reach out to the worst impacted districts in Maharashtra and are starting with 15 districts based on national data that include districts across Vidarbha, Marathwada, Central and Western Maharashtra (Beed, Jalna, Hingoli, Gadchiroli, Satara, Nasik, Sinnar, Gadchiroli, Auranbagad, Parbhani, Buldana, Osmanabad, Pune and sometime soon Amravati as well). The OC facilities are being dispatched to District hospitals, municipal and Zillaparishad hospitals through civil surgeons, collectors. Project Mumbai has merged Environment with Livelihood to celebrate World Environment day on 4th June, 2021 with the Mumbai Recyclothon Initiative. For every kg of plastic donated to them, they will provide ten kgs of groceries to families in need to help their livelihood. Update received on 26th May, 2021. Project Mumbai launched vaccination for inmates of Arthur road jail and people without documents on 2 June. 169 inmates of Mumbai Central Jail (Arthur Road), who do not possess identity cards, were given the #JabToBeatCorona today. Link for film - <https://youtu.be/cOgTWA5KIXs>. Two Isolation Centres supported by PROJECT MUMBAI for COVID Positive patients are now ready in Najam Bagh, Dongri area and the Imamwada school as

on 4 June. They will also be equipped with Oxygen concentrators and other healthcare facilities. On 7 June, second film premiered- **Project Mumbai and Mahapeconet**. Vaccination for Senior Citizens: Simple and Easy Process. Link - <https://youtu.be/DugSjfNrPD0>. PROJECT MUMBAI started vaccination at the Byculla Women's Prison on 11th June, 2021. The first dose was administered to over hundred inmates, including foreign nationals, and some of the staff. They also donated Oxygen Concentrators for the 450 plus capacity in prison. On 12 June, **Project Mumbai and Pratham** started a free toll free number to help people across India facing problems with Oxygen Concentrators. There are close to fifty trained technicians available on call 24 x7 who will guide citizens on the phone. On 14 June, third and final film to break the cycle of misinformation released. Link - <https://youtu.be/FA4i7OTOPPU>. On 18 June, **Project Mumbai and MahaPeconet** launched a 3 part podcast series with Dr. Amole Gupte on COVID 19 and CAB protocol. On 29 June, 2021 signed an MoU with the Government of Maharashtra to commit funding of education expenses of four hundred children who have been orphaned due to Covid-19 in the first phase. On 30th July, Project Mumbai in partnership with MCGM started door to door vaccination for the bedridden. It will further spread this project from ward to ward. Close to 5000 citizens in Mumbai have so far



registered for this help and who have been bedridden for over six months or more. On 5 August, signed an MoU with government of Maharashtra and Collector of Gadchiroli for 100 per cent mobile vaccination across the tribal district of Gadchiroli and IEC on vaccine hesitation. A separate MoU was signed between Project Mumbai and SEARCH run by Dr Abhay Bang and Rani Bang in Gadchiroli and government of Maharashtra launching the Aarogya swarajya initiative- empowering communities towards healthcare- preparing for the third wave and beyond. the pilot project report will help replicate this model in other districts. This is the first in Maharashtra. This is over and above the 15 districts that Project Mumbai has adopted for oxygen and health infra support.

- **The LIFE Foundation** - 500 diapers to St. George hospital on 9 April. Donated 20 ltrs of sanitizer, 300 face shields and 1000 gloves to Cama hospital for the doctors and health care workers on 26 April. Donated 2500 N95 masks to hospitals for doctors, healthcare workers and staff. Distributed ration to 40 families of children with special needs on 21 May. 800 Appy soft drinks to Covid Warriors at Cama Hospital on 24 May. On 16 June distributed 500 diapers to GT Hospital. On 23 June distributed 200 ration kits to daily wage earners in Matheran. On 6 July Wheel chair donated to a handicapped boy staying in Bharat nagar Bandra aged 22 who has been on bed without any movement since he was 13 yrs old.
- **YUVA**, organised a training of 50 youth volunteers running Vaccination Help Desks across MMR to - i. Address issues on the ground ii. Reporting data iii. Process of registration iv. FAQs. YUVA - MMR - Through the crowd funding efforts of the Together We Can 2.0 campaign monthly ration kits have been provided to 4,494 urban poor households across the Mumbai Metropolitan Region as on 19 June. 369 hygiene kits have been distributed to

community members. Cooked meals are being provided once a day to 600 families of the homeless and migrant workers in two urban poor communities in Mumbai's Western Suburbs, supported by Khaana Chahiye. As on 19 June, vaccine help desks in 20 areas of the Mumbai Metropolitan Region have reached out to 1,626+ people, helped onboard 656 on the CoWin platform, booked vaccine slots for 100 persons, and guided 33 persons to vaccine centres nearby for on-spot registration and vaccination. 113 youth volunteers are currently on the ground running these help desks. YUVAs community centres across cities have facilitated 522 identity documents and 526 government welfare scheme registrations. 6 new community groups have been formed. **The Childline Team**, working for the rescue and rehabilitation of children from adverse circumstances, has handled 150+ cases, with majority cases focused on protecting children from abuse, addressing children's need for a safe shelter, and related to children's food and nutritional requirements. **Maha PECOnet** is expanding its Vaccine Help Desk (VHD) model to include collaboration with **Faith Based Organisations (FBOs)** in order to augment the current vaccination drives and address vaccine hesitancy - FBOs engaged - Archdiocese of Bombay, Jamaat-I-Hind, Anjuman-i-Islamia, The Buddhist Society of India, United Singh Sabha, Iskcon and Brahma Kumaris. Training Sessions conducted on setting up VHDs, addressing misinformation through FAQs and building communication skills. Rapid Needs Assessment initiated in MMR, Nagpur, Amravati and Akola. Total 442HH surveyed till 21 June. 3 VHDs have been set up in Nagpur, Amravati and Akola respectively. Special Vaccination Camps in collaboration with the local government are conducted at the VHDs in Nagpur and Akola providing vaccines to people at the VHD itself. 47 people were vaccinated in Akola and 63 people in Nagpur on



21 June. **YUVA** raised INR 3.5 lakhs and distributed 350 meals per day for a month in July to vulnerable families in Sanjay Gandhi National Park. The meals were cooked by SHG women providing relief to the families and livelihood support to SHG women.

- **United Way Mumbai** supporting 127 medical institutions providing protective equipment, hospital equipment and hospital supplies, 13,29,730 people benefitted till 11 August. Through their Youth Against Covid-19 Campaign, enrolled 2353 students across 36 colleges. 36 training sessions conducted and 1200 students reached via training sessions. Total number of students using Whatsapp to send messages: 379, Whatsapp reach: 24,251; Instagram stories number of times # used: 354; Facebook posts number of times # used: 70. Assisted 60,907 people in getting vaccinated in urban areas. Distributed 3278 ration kits till 11 August. United Way Mumbai in collaboration with **UNICEF and MCGM**, is running a campaign to address COVID-19 vaccine hesitancy and promote COVID 19 Appropriate Behavior (CAB) amongst community members of high rise buildings and urban slums in the select 12 municipal wards across Mumbai. Shared on 15 June. United Way Mumbai was featured on TOI for the very same initiative on 16th June, 2021. United way Mumbai with the support of **UNICEF** has started a project on strengthening Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) among 25 hospitals in the Mumbai Metropolitan Region.

On the lines of raising awareness, the team is helping the hospitals establish and strengthen the SOPs for IPC, Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) and Biomedical Waste Management (BMWM). Equipment and consumables will be provided to strengthen IPC infrastructure based on a detailed needs assessment in the hospitals. The team is also developing Information, Education and Communication materials to set up at the hospitals. Regular training and meetings will be conducted for doctors, nurses, and other ancillary staff, as shared on 7 July. United Way Mumbai is implementing "Stop the stead" campaign across 25 districts of India. In Maharashtra, working in Mumbai, Thane, Pune and Nagpur. On 7 July there was a vaccination camp organized in the sub-centre by the TMC (after almost 15 days gap) and 37 out of 100 vaccines administered were to the tribals mobilized.

- **UNICEF Mumbai** made surge deployment of 10 experts from RedR India to SDMA, Maharashtra and 4 Municipal Corporations: Mumbai, Pune, Nashik and Nagpur for strengthening public health system, anticipatory risk governance and preparation for third wave. On 22nd July IKEA in collaboration with UNICEF supplied 5 liters of sanitisers cans to hospitals, sanitation workers, coolie association, fire brigade, police staff, bus drivers, health staff and patients. A total of 30,000 liters of sanitizers were distributed in Mumbai by CACR in Mumbai and 20,000 litres by CYDA in Pune. On 30th July, 400 LPM PSA Oxygen Generation plants supplied by UNICEF (1/5 plants supported in Maharashtra) reached DH Nanded for installation. On 1 August, 55 Commercial Sex workers vaccinated in Nashik with facilitation from **RedR and UNICEF**.
- **Global Shapers** along with **RISE Infinity foundation, CACR and RING** : 1200 Menstrual health kits distributed (Impact - 1200 menstruators for 2months) across Maharashtra Kit Contents i. 3 Asmita Pads, ii. UNICEF



educational Booklet, iii. 2 Soaps, iv. Paper bags for safe disposal, v. Red Marker.

- **CYDA** - Between 15-29 April Distributed 507 Dry rations kits to migrants worker and daily wages people 980 Calls/ Whatsapp recieved at help desk 23 people recieved Plasma and Medicine 73 people assisted to get Hospital beds 3000 Soaps and Masks distributed 750 Migrants reach out 63 people placed for jobs 62 volunteers engaged in campaign Social Media reach out - 200000 News channels featured- 10 News channles and reach out 500000 No of people reach out through community van in Nandurbar-11500 No. of people Assisted in getting Vaccinated in sinner - 1704 No. of people Assisted in getting Vaccinated in Nandurbar- 1750 between. Started a Help line in Pune with a team dedicated to connecting patients and families to Ventilator beds in hospitals or with needed medicines: 420 calls resolved till 27 May. #Yes2 vaccination and No2 ventilator campaign started in Nandurbar district with the support of **NSE foundation**, ZP Nandurbar, NSS, Senior science College of shahada, Finish society and CYDA. A campaign vehicle designed to convey messages on vaccination drive in Nandurbar on 6 May 2021. The vaccination campaign vehicle will be going to each village and block to start a discussion on the importance of vaccination through use of creative means like IEC messages, songs etc. The campaign has been telecasted across Nandurbar's local language TV channel. Till 6 May more than 15500 people reached from 46 villages and 2 urban areas. With the support of **Help Children in Need Foundation**, CYDA delivered 10 fowler beds to Taloda Sub District Hospital as per the requirement submit by the Govt. Nandurbar on 11 May. CYDA in collaboration with **The LIFE foundation**, Mumbai and Pimpri Chichwada Municipal Corporations inaugurated Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar COVID Care Centre in Yerwada, Pune which was inaugurated on 21st May, 2021. They

partnered with the **Pune Mahanagarpalika and Sou Sheela Raj Salve Memorial Trust**, Pune to set up this centre along with a 40 bed Children COVID Care Unit. The facilities include 10 oxygen beds, 20 senior citizen beds, 130 isolation beds, X-ray and labs and 24x7 doctors, nurses and ambulance services. As per CYDAs report on 75 days of covid response on 17 June, 97,113 people vaccinated and 5,00,000 people reached. Pune urban: 68,866 people vaccinated; Nandurbar:13,911 vaccinated; Sinnar Taluka: 6,435 vaccinated; Medical and non medical supplies distributed in Pune, Nandurbar, Indapur and Satara. 1704 whatsapp/calls received at the help desk. 4209 ration kits distributed. On 20 June, CYDA and **Tech Mahindra** distributed 150 Dry Ration Kits to daily wage earners, migrant labour and construction workers in Sus Gaon, Dhayri and Pimpri Area of Pune. On 22 June, **NSE Foundation** with on ground support of CYDA handed over 30 Fowlers Beds with mattresses, pillow and IV saline stand to Nandurbar district authority. On 1 July, With support of **John Deere India Pvt Ltd and United Way Mumbai**, CYDA team handed over 10 oxygen concentrator to Dr Balasaheb ambedkar covid care center, Yerawada. Ensuring school readiness for IPC and CAB: WASH in Schools training for development partners conducted by **CYDA, Health Department and UNICEF** on 8 and 9 July. On 22nd July, CYDA in collaboration with NOKIA covered 94 in- home surveys. In Nashik in collaboration with the Federal Bank, Network 18, Apollo Hospital and United Way reached out



to 189 people and vaccinated 529 people. Pune Urban (PMC) in collaboration with SwissAid and MahaPecoNet reached out to a total of 1407 people and vaccinated 1284 people.

- **Save the Children** is supporting vaccination centers in Nashik and assisting people in registering for the vaccine. They have supplied a total of 100 oxygen concentrators to NMC, PCMC, Thane and the Nashik division, towards strengthening public healthcare infrastructure partnering with **Palladium and Maha PecoNet** on 17 May.
- **Save The Children in collaboration with CYDA** handed over Sanitizer- 60 Litre, Mask N95- 300, Head Cap- 400, Hand Gloves- 10 Box, PPE kit- 300 kit, Dustbin- 15, Sodium Hydro Chloride- 45 liter, Oximeter- 6, Thermometer- 6, Soaps- 1500, Hand Wash Liquid- 30 Liter, Drug spray pump- 10 to Indapur Sub District Hospital on 29 May.
- **Persistent Foundation and CYDA** handed over 2 ventilators to Sub District Hospital Indapur for Children's ward on 2 June.
- **Triratna Prerna Mandal (TPM)** along with **Alert Citizen Forum** in collaboration with **MahaPECONet 2.0** distributed 327 self care kits with soaps to "Swachha Mumbai Prabodhan Abhiyan Workers (SMPA)" from Santacruz to Bandra, West and some of East on 23 May. TPM initiated special vaccination drive with Tribal Hamlets in Aarey Colony. On 8 July 2021 team **TPM** in association with **ACF, MahaPECONet** and with the help of local Shakhapramukh from Goregaon, P South ward distributed 250 safety kits (Moisturizing eye drops, Pocket Sanitizers, 2 N95 masks)with 2 Lux 100 gms soaps to Sanitation Workers of SWM workers (motor loaders, sweepers).
- **Rise Infinity Foundation** - MMR- Distributed 72 ration kits to migrants in Nerul, Sion and Navi Mumbai and assisting in the resolution of Covid patient emergencies by connecting patient/families to verified

vendors/sources/hospitals. Resolution of 72 cases done and logistic support for 7 oxygen cylinders provided till 5 June. **RISE Infinity Foundation**: Organization has worked towards providing emergency oxygen, drugs and other medical supplies to Covid patients. Distributed 5 oxygen concentrators to critical patients and families. They are also in the process of supplying 30 oxygen concentrators to 3 rural and district hospitals of Palghar District.

Celebratory Network, Coast, Step up wellbeing, Rise Infinity Foundation started a series of wellness workshops filled with self help tips to increase their mental and physical health of volunteers on the field. The first session took place on 4 June. Conducted role of youth in social change workshop and #YoungWarrior Program to enable youth to take action on a platform created by Yuwaah and Unicef on 8 June. **Bahubali Gulabchand Foundation** along with RIF donated 20 Fowler's beds to the Subdistrict Hospital in Pandharpur and District Hospital in Karmala, both in Solapur district on 16 June. Donation of 10 pediatric bipaps and 5 pediatric Monitors to Nijampur Municipal Hospital by Dewas Bhopal Corridor Pvt Ltd through **Rise Infinity Foundation** on 8 July. On 16 and 17 July distributed 164 ration kits in Ulhasnagar Supported by **Leidos and United Way Mumbai**.

- **Palladium** with support from **Tech Mahindra Foundation** supplied 120 beds to 3 district hospitals of Pune and Sangli and 10 concentrations to Nashik Municipal Corporations on 11 May.
- **Bharatiya Jain Sangathana (BJS)** started Mission Oxygen Bank to ensure timely supply of oxygen. The BJS has also conducted the Rapid Antigen tests on 40,252 people in Pimpri Chindwada Municipal Corporation (PCMC) and Ahmednagar. And also supported the Government to set up and operate 103 vaccination centres in MCGM, Pune Municipal



Corporation, PCMC, NMMC and Ahmednagar these centres have vaccinated 12,75,071 people so far. (One Shot: 9,26,131 and Both shots : 3,48,940). Bhartiya Jain Sangathan released their consolidated reports outlining their impact numbers till 1 June 2021. According to the report, the number of people who have done health check ups in the Medical camp in Dharavi (between 18th April - 1 June) - Total : 16,760. Total No. of people who took antigen tests through their facility in Ahmednagar (between 24th March - 1 June) - : 76,609. Total No. of people vaccinated in Ahmednagar in BJS supported vaccination centres (between 6th March - 1 June) - 15,74,427

- **The Jain temple** at Sub Urban Mumbai, has been converted into a full-fledged vaccination centre with CCTV cameras, refrigerators to store vaccine vials and rooms for doctors. The drive at the temple, listed as Tarunbharat Jain Mandir Mandir on the CoWin App, will be conducted by Seven Hills Hospital. Jain Organization has also started a COVID centre at Hindu Gymkhana in Mumbai with capacity of 100 bed.
- **TECH Mahindra Foundation SMART Healthcare Academy** is setting up the COVID Swayam Suraksha Training for sanitation workers, Anganwadi Workers and NGO volunteers. This training program strengthens the self-protection behaviour along with occupation specific protective measures. They

have trained over 1000+ warriors PAN India and now are looking for more volunteers to train. Update shared on 19 May. **Tech Mahindra Foundation** donated 20 well equipped basic life support ambulances to charitable hospitals in 12 districts of India on 9th Aug 2021.

- **Red Is The New Green (RING)**, supported 600 female ward staff and doctors at Nesco Covid Centre, Goregaon with reusable period products as requested by them. The female staff spoke about how managing periods was difficult for them during continuous long shifts. They also distributed reusable period underwear offering a comfortable solution to manage periods and ensuring no leakage. 400 packets of sanitary napkins to Sewri TB hospital for their covid positive patients, hospital staff and TB patients on 4 June. Conducted a series of MHM workshops at the Savera Training Centre, Grant Road and provided them with sanitary napkins. Also exploring skill development opportunities with the women (reusable cloth pads), as shared on 7 July.
- **Apnalaya** Between April 24 - 15 June, has provided dry ration and hygiene kits to 8421 households in M East Ward and plans to extend its efforts in 35 slums of the Ward in the next few weeks.

- **CASA** India's Gender Desk has joined efforts to connect COVID patients to hospital resources. More than 300 information sources have been verified and stored for usage. In addition the group has also set up a blood and plasma donation request group and we have 26 registered donors. CASA -West Zone has initiated the process to create awareness in 10 districts of rural Maharashtra & Mumbai (Nanded, Latur, Nandurbar, Ahmednagar, Aurangabad, Gondia ,wasim, Yavatmal , Beed , Mumbai). CASA will be covering more than 300 villages and also providing 4000 masks and 2 soaps each to 4000 households in the rural vilalages of this district . In Kaper Nandurbar 160 patients of covid patients will be supported by cash transfer. CASA went on to distribute over 13000 pamphlets on the importance of vaccination and 4500 hygiene kits in a drive through 5 districts of Maharashtra. The districts covered were Gondia, Nager, Nandurbar, Aurangabad and Latur) on 20 May.
- **CYDAs** #YES 2 Vaccination and No to ventilator campaign started from 26 April 2021 in Haveli with 5 Primary Health Care centre in Collaboration with Save the children and Youthaid Global. Total 10 volunteers engaged in 5 PHC (Uralikanchan, loni kalbhor, Kunjirwadi, Khadakwasla, Wagholi). Assisted 7,901 people in getting vaccinated till 18 June in Pune rural. With support of John Deere India Pvt Ltd and **United Way Mumbai**, CYDA team handed over 5 oxygen concentrator for sub district rural hospital indapur, 5 oxygen concentrator for Mulshi sub district rural hospital on 1 July. On 22 July Pune Rural in collaboration with **Save the Children** reached out to a total of 241 people and vaccinated 105 people.
- **The LIFE Foundation** continuing their rural initiative on 12 May 2021, handed over - 700 Rapid Antigen Test Kits, 25 Pulse Oxymeters, 200 Reusable Masks. - **RCSD** in partnership with **Unicef Mumbai** involved with 'Corona Mukta Panchayat' endorsed by central government shared with 100 GPs covering 20 districts, oriented GP members and functionaries and community; resolution taken by 100 GPs to endorse responsible behavior to make GPs corona free.
